 one thousand eight hundred and eighty one, personally
 appeared before me a Justice of the Peace within
 and for ~~the~~ County and State of Georgia Henry Reid
 aged years a resident of Carroll County, in
 the State of Georgia who being duly sworn accord-
 -ing to law declares that he is the identical Henry
Reid who was a private in the Company Comm-
 -anded by Captain Jonas Fouché of Militia
 -Service in the Georgia Regiment of Militia
 Command according to the of his remem-
 -brance by Lieut- Col William Melton,

in the War between the United States and the
 Creek Indians in the years A D 1793, 1794, 1795 and
 1796, that he volunteered on the day of

A D 1793 or 1794, ~~for~~ the term of
 during said War and continued in actual
 Service in said War for the term of two years
 or thereabouts and was honorably discharged
 at Greensborough in Green County Georgia on
 or about the day of AD 1796,

and that he does not recollect of ever having
 received a Written Certificate of Discharge but
 received Certificates for a month at a time some
 of which were delivered up upon being paid off, the
 balance are lost or mislaid which fact, ^{of said Company} will appear ^{in the rolls}

He makes this Declaration for the purpose of obtain-
 -ing the Bounty land to which he may be entitled
 under the act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers
 and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Service of
 the United States passed 28th September 1850

I am to have your August 4th 1852

Sir

I received yours of the
10th March in relation to the claim of Henry Rice
for Bounty land for his service, Capt James Smith
Co of Geo. Vols in 1793 & 94. You informed me
that it was supposed that the rolls of said Company
had been burned and that he must make further
proof of his service. It was impossible at this
late day to make proof by persons who served
with him, I therefore in accordance with
your instructions, procured an affidavit of
some five or six of the most respectable citizens
of our County who testified that they had
been long acquainted with the applicant
and that his character for truth and veracity
was beyond question good and that they
would be bound to believe him. This I
forwarded you about the first of April
last and have had no intelligence from
the case. You will please inform
us of the disposal of the same and
point out the defect if any exist.
