Yes, my DNA test number is 50817.

With family Tree DNA I had Y-DNA 111, mtDNA, and autosomal DNA Family Finder.

I have 2 matches at Y111, the same 2 at 67 markers, and 8 at 37 markers. But, have not found a paper trail to and of these.

At The family reunion last year, I told the family that I had found George Collins 1965 – 1845 in Hancock County Georgia he was the father of Henderson Collins 1792-1848. George married Sarah Betts in Delaware ( at the time it was part of Maryland) and Migrated with Sarah's Father Samuel Betts with about 30 other People to Hancock

County Georgia.

We have very few sources on William Smith 1771- Deceased , However, Sara Gammage was living in the household of William Harvey Smith 1830-1899 in the 1860 Census.

I called your mother today and gave her some ID's and Passwords to pass them on to you, so you can access the records. Just don't pass this information to other web sites. I sure would appreciate any help you can give me so just correct any errors your find.
