This last Will & Testament of Waugh Gammall is, It bears to  
my Son Jeremiah Gammall the Grant of Land on Whore's Run  
That a Tract of Land lying on Coadora Run may be divided  
between my Daughters Anna Gammall & Margaret Gammall  
& their heirs for ever Likewise I desire that my five Negroes  
with their Offspring may Equally be divided between my Wife  
& my Children Likewise I desire that my father & Mother  
May have an Equal Mountanure with my Wife & Children if  
my wife should dye That my father & Mother should have  
an Equal Mountanure with my Children under the Disposal  
of Thomas Stone Likewise I desire that my father & mother  
With my Wife & Children may live on this plantation Likewise  
I desire that if the Lord be pleased to call my Wife to him  
Thomas Stone may be sole Executor Over my Children Likewise  
I desire w<sup>th</sup> all my Goods & Chattells may Equally be divided between  
my Wife & my Children this is my last Will & Testament this  
Seventh day of June in the Year of our Lord God One Thousand  
Seven hundred & twenty Six as Witness my hand & Seal  
Likewise I desire if Thomas Stone should dye w<sup>th</sup> my Children  
should be brought under the family of Brownough

In the Name of God Amen this Seventh day  
of June One thousand Seven hundred twenty Six I John Jones  
being very Sick & weak of body but of perfect mind & memory do  
ordain & constitute this my last will & Testament in Manner & form  
following First I Give my Soul to God that Gave it me & my body  
to the Earth to be & solemnly buried at the Discretion of my Executors  
nothing doubting but at the Generall resurrection I shall receive  
the same again by the Mighty power of God & as touching my  
Worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this  
World I Give & bequeath as followeth Item I Give to my  
Son John Jones One hundred Acres of Land lying & bounding  
on the South Side of White Oak Swamp more or less & one  
Sut of Oaths & one Dove & Call & one heifer  
Item I Give to my Son George Jones Seventy three Acres of  
Land more or less being on the branches of Lamps Crooke all the  
Smiths Tools & three heifers Item I Give & bequeath to my Son  
Thomas Jones Seventy three Acres of Land lying & bounding  
on the South Side of Lamps Crook & my best Sut of Oaths  
& my Gun & three heifers Item I Give to my Son James Jones  
three heifers and a pair of good Oaths & the house plantation  
After the decease of Mother Item I Give & bequeath to my  
Daughter Mary Jones One Negro named Pross her Turnas  
for ever & one Dove & Call Item I Give to my Daughter  
Catharine One Dove & Call Item I Give to my Daughter  
Sarah Jones One Dove & Call
