That a Tract of Land lying on Goadore Run may be apportioned
Between my Daughters Anna Barnall & Margaret Barnall
in their lives for ever Likewise I give that my two Negroes
with their spouses may Equally be divided Between my Wife
& my Children Likewise I give that my Father & Mother
May have equal Maintenance with my Wife & Likewise if
my wife should die That my Father & Mother should have
an equal Maintenance with my Children under the disposal
of Thomas Stone Likewise I desire that my Father & mother
With my Wife & Children may live on this plantation Likewise
I give that if the Lord be pleased to call my Wife to him
Thomas Stone may be sole Executor over my Children Likewise
I give all my Goods & Chattels may Equally be divided between
my Wife & my Children this is my last Will & Testament this
Second Day of June in the Year of our Lord God One Thousand
Seven hundred & twenty six as witness my hand & Seal
Likewise I give if Thomas Stone should die w^t my Children
Should be brought under the family of Bronagh

In the Name of God Amen the Second day
of June One thousand Seven hundred twenty six I the undersigned
being very sick & weak of body but of perfect mind memory do —
ordain & constitute this my last will & testament in manner & form
following First I Give my Soul to God that bears it up my body
to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Execut^r
nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall rise
the same again by the Mighty power of God & as touching my
Worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this
World I Give & bequeath as followeth Item I Give to my
Son John Jones One hundred Acres of Land lying bounding
on the South side of White Oak Swamp more or less one
Sett of Sloaths & One Dore & Calf & one heifer —
Item I Give to my Son George Jones Seventy three Acres of
Land more or less being on the branch of Lamb's Brook all the
Smith Tools & three heifers Item I Give & bequeath to my son
Thomas Jones Seventy three Acres of Land lying & bounding
on the South side of Lamb's Brook & my best Sett of Sloaths
& my Gun & three heifers Item I Give to my Son James Jones
Three heifers and a set of good Sloaths & the lower plantation
After the goods of Mother Item I Give & bequeath to my
daughter Mary Jones One Negro named Bess & her Turners
for ever & One Dore & Calf Item I Give to my daughter
Elizabeth One Dore & Calf Item I Give to my daughter
Sarah Jones One Dore & Calf
